Set in present-day Sarajevo (Bosnia-Herzegovina), this film is the quiet, confidently told story of a young man who goes to visit his uncle and aunt. Through conversations and everyday situations we discover their post-war traumas. Their son died in the war seven years earlier, an experience they still struggle with. The parents come to stand for an entire society struggling to move on, to forgive and forget. When he plans to leave, the nephew can't get his car started and decides to stay. The compass of the film expands, and manages to faithfully depict everyday life in Bosnia with subtle humor and surprising twists.
